Under French domestic rules, you became a French Tax Resident the day after you arrive in this country with the intention of staying indefinitely or for a long period in France.

France is the location of your main residence (not for an intern or people who you spend less than 183 days/year in France (ex. co-tutelle)) and of your main income so, you'll have to pay an **"Impôt sur le Revenu"** (Tax Income)

Under the Law, it is <u>your responsibility to make yourself known to the French Tax Authorities</u> and to fully declare your income, capital gains and wealth (CNRS, AMU, ECM... declare your salary but it's not sufficient).

For 2017, you will have to pay a tax on your 2016 Salary.

- If you are a PhD student payed by a French organism: you will have to pay
- If you are a PhD student payed by another country (CSC grant...): look at the tax treaty (and on your contract)
- If you are a <u>PhD</u>, <u>Post-doc or invited Teacher who stay less than 2 years in France</u>: International tax treaties exist for researchers and may allow you not to pay taxes if you come from a country listed in "Annexe 1" or "Annexe 2" (country of origin before your stay in France, NOT your nationality!- see attached document)

NB:

- 1- If you are also be considered as tax resident under the rules of another country, check if there is a double tax treaty with France.
- 2- If you decide to go abroad (after your PhD for example) but your wife/children still live in France, you'll always be considered as a resident, even if you work abroad...
- 3- If you worked in France in 2016 and leave in 2017, you also must have to pay.
- 4- Married couples or PACS must complete joint tax returns.

You'll need to file it, sign it and send it to your tax office*

case $n^{\circ}2$: You have already declare your situation last year, the deadline to file your income tax statement is **May 17** (by post) and **May 23** (by internet)

You can declare your income from now on $\frac{\text{http://www.impots.gouv.fr/}}{\text{monoming personal code (3 numbers : N° fiscal, N° télédéclarant & Revenu fiscal de référence).}}$

You could also had received your "déclaration préremplie" by post. You just have to check the amount of your "revenu net imposable" on your <u>December 2016 Payslip</u>. Go to the website and follow the procedure.

- From August to November 2017: If you have made any mistake in your declaration, you can correct it directly on-line from August, 1st.
- 16 october 2017: last payment of the year for people who pay monthly (No payment in november and december). 1st declaration, you will have to pay in 1 or 3 payment.
